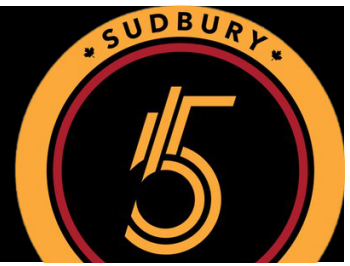

SEASON OPENER

- The Stallions started off their 2022 campaign Saturday with an exhibition game against TBL newcomer Reading Rebels and continue pre-season prep Sunday, when the Sudbury Five come to town as part of the NBL Canada/TBL Challenge
- Sunday's contest features the Sudbury Five of the National Basketball League of Canada (NBL Canada) in the TBL x NBL Canada Challenge. This will be the first of 3 meetings for the Stallions against NBL Canada sides. The Stallions will meet up with the Five again on March 18th in Sudbury, ON

LAST NIGHT VS. READING

- Despite only returning 3 members of last year TBL National Championship Runner-Up Team, the Stallions picked right back up with a dominant 127-90 win over TBL Newcomers Reading Rebels. The Stallions were led by Rookie James Towns who recorded 25 points, 7 rebounds, and 6 assists in 28 minutes off the bench. Christian Nobles wasn't too far behind recording 21 points. Every Stallion recorded points last night and each starter recorded double-digit point totals.

NICE TO SEE YOU AGAIN

- Stallion Newcomer Devin Gilligan is no stranger for Sudbury. Gilligan was a member of the Five during the 2018-19 campaign playing in 42 games for the NBL Canada team.
- Gilligan averaged 9.0 ppg and 4.2 rpg for the Five while shooting 46.4% from the field and 35.9% from beyond the arc.
- When talking with Devin about playing his former team, he said he is "real excited to play Sudbury this weekend, looking forward to seeing some old friends and competing against a great team".

SUDBURY PREVIEW

- Sunday's game will conclude 3 games in 4 days against TBL opponents. On Monday, Sudbury opened up their NBL Canada regular season with a 113-108 win against the Windsor Express.
- Thursday at the Indiana All-Americans, the Five fell by a score of 103-99
- Friday at Toledo Glass City, the Five lead by as many as 18 but couldn't hold on and fell 102-100
- Sudbury has multiple players with previous NCAA Division 1 experience with Evan Harris and Zena Edosomwan (Harvard), Jaylen Bland (UC Riverside), Jason Calliste (Oregon), Jeremy Harris (Buffalo), Tyrell Gumbs-Frater (Coastal Carolina), Marcel White (Jacksonville), and Josiah Moore (Tennessee Tech).

SYRACUSE STALLIONS HEAD COACH PAT BEILEIN

- Signed on to be the 3rd Head Coach in Stallions history on September 1st, 2021
- Most recently coached at LeMoyne College where he compiled a record of 77-41 in four seasons with the Dolphins
- In 2017-18, Beilein led the Dolphins to an NCAA Elite Eight finish
- In 2017 and 2018, Beilein was awarded NE-10 Conference Coach of the Year
- Prior to his time at LeMoyne, Beilein was on staff with the Utah Jazz as a Player Development Coach under Quin Snyder
- Beilein was the head men's basketball coach at Division II West Virginia Wesleyan College for two seasons, during which time he guided the Bobcats to a record of 32-27. In his first season in Buckhannon, Beilein led the Bobcats to a 12-15 record and a berth in the last West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) Championship
- Tallied 1,001 career points for West Virginia University and ranked second on the program's all-time list in three-pointers made with 242 at the time of his graduation
- As a senior co-captain, Beilein was fourth on the team in points [263], third in steals [36] and assists [73] and fifth in rebounds [71] and helped the Mountaineers to the 2006 NCAA Tournament Atlanta Regional Semifinal [Sweet 16]
- As a junior, West Virginia advanced to the NCAA Tournament Albuquerque Regional Final [Elite 8], where Beilein was named to the All-Tournament Team. In 2004, the Mountaineers advanced to the NIT Quarterfinals
- Following graduation, Beilein played in the 2006 NBA Summer League for the Houston Rockets. He then went overseas for two seasons and played for Landstede Zwolle in Holland and then UCD Marian in the Ireland SuperLeague
