SYRACUSE STALLIONS HEAD COACH PAT BEILEIN

- Signed on to be the 3rd Head Coach in Stallions history on September 1st, 2021
- Most recently coached at LeMoyne College where he compiled a record of 77-41 in four seasons with the Dolphins
- In 2017-18, Beilein led the Dolphins to an NCAA Elite Eight finish
- In 2017 and 2018, Beilein was awarded NE-10 Conference Coach of the Year
- Prior to his time at LeMoyne, Beilein was on staff with the Utah Jazz as a Player Development Coach under Quin Snyder
- Beilein was the head men's basketball coach at Division II West Virginia Wesleyan College for two seasons, during which time he guided the Bobcats to a record of 32-27. In his first season in Buckhannon, Beilein led the Bobcats to a 12-15 record and a berth in the last West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) Championship
- Tallied 1,001 career points for West Virginia University and ranked second on the program's all-time list in three-pointers made with 242 at the time of his graduation
- As a senior co-captain, Beilein was fourth on the team in points (263), third in steals (36) and assists (73) and fifth in rebounds (71) and helped the Mountaineers to the 2006 NCAA Tournament Atlanta Regional Semifinal (Sweet 16)
- As a junior, West Virginia advanced to the NCAA Tournament Albuquerque Regional Final (Elite 8), where Beilein was named to the All-Tournament Team. In 2004, the Mountaineers advanced to the NIT Quarterfinals
- Following graduation, Beilein played in the 2006 NBA Summer League for the Houston Rockets. He then went overseas for two seasons and played for Landstede Zwolle in Holland and then UCD Marian in the Ireland SuperLeague
